Communication in the Therapeutic Relationship

understands Effective communication skills will help maximize the therapeutic relationship Communication can include both verbal and non-verbal forms, and includes the ability to connect with and understand a person's state of mind and emotions

What communication skills have you demonstrated? Nurses must develop the skills necessary to inspire trust and maintain a professional relationship with children of all ages and levels of emotional and psychological development Compassion, conscience and commitment to the therapeutic relationship by the nurse should not demand or require

Communication Skills Necessary in a Therapeutic Relationship

These issues increase the need for solid communication skills in a therapeutic relationship between the nurse and patient, to asses and treat the patient, establish trust, demonstrate empathy and understanding, and map out a care plan that the patient will understand (Lewis et al, 2013) The development of specialized communication skills is

Primary skills associated with the communication of empathy include: a nonverbal and verbal attending b paraphrasing content of client communications c reflecting patient feelings and implicit messages a ATTENDING - involves our behaviors which reflect our paying full attention, in an accepting and supportive way, to the client b

communication skills is clear, relatively few instructional programs exist today focused specifically on developing effective communication skills for nursing students More specifically, specialized communication skills training programs are needed to help nurses learn to break bad news (BBN) and communicate about end-of-life (EOL)
