### **Toys and games from the past - Victoria and Albert Museum**

From the 1870s, manufacturers began making toys for the beach including buckets, spades, sieves and sand mills Initially these were made of wood, but soon tin became more common, especially for buckets as it gave more opportunity for colourful patterns and pictures Today most seaside toys are made of plastic, which means they no longer become rusty

### **Alaska Native Art - Federal Trade Commission**

Relief print making is done from a raised surface, like cut stone, linoleum block, or wood block Intaglio print making is created using the recessed image from the surface of etchings or engravings on metal plates of copper and tin Lithography uses an oil-water resistance technique to print a design from stone or metal plates to paper

### **Pewter plates from São Julião da Barra, Tagus river, Portugal.**

Pewter is an alloy of tin and lead used at least since the Greek times When it is new it presents a beautiful silver, turning darker as it ages and becoming gray with a lustrous shine Most items were cast in heavy bronze moulds, sometimes in several pieces making it very easy to cast objects Lead melts at 328° C (662° F), boils at 1740

**The Technique of Egyptian Faience**
