The Titanic was a White Star Line steamship built in the early nineteen hundreds by Harland and Wolff of Belfast, Ireland At the time of her construction, she was the largest moving object ever built With a weight of more than 46,000 tons, a length of nearly 900

The name Titanic derives from the Titans of Greek mythology Built in Belfast, Ireland, in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland (as it was then known), the RMS Titanic was the second of the three Olympic-class ocean liners—the first was the RMS Olympic and the third was the HMHS Britannic Britannic was originally to be called Gigantic and was to be over 1,000 feet (300 m) long
